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Aims

The aims of this session were to:

- learn about gathering data to understand demand, capacity and activity in CTAC services
- · share network members' experiences of gathering data for improvement, and
- plan a test of tools to understand Demand, Capacity, Activity, Queue (DCAQ) data in CTAC services.

Who attended

60 participants from across 12 NHS boards and the Scottish Government attended, including:



team leaders

primary care managers, and

senior managers.

This gave participants the opportunity to share experiences and understand the national context.

CTAC Network Health Survey

Centrifuges request

In response to the discussion on the network MS Teams channel, we have asked the Scottish Health Technologies Group to work with the CTAC Network to produce an evidence summary on the use of centrifuges in CTAC teams. This work will be led by Healthcare Improvement Scotland, with a small group of network members to ensure the evidence meets your needs.



CTAC Network Mapping Tool

Healthcare Improvement Scotland are in discussion with Scottish Government to ensure that the Mapping Tool currently in development will be aligned with the Primary Care Improvement Tracker request. Once ready, the tool will be sent to network members to complete. Results will be collated and made available on the CTAC Network MS Teams channel. We hope this will be a practical resource teams can use to share learning across Scotland.

Spotlight session

Intro to Demand, Capacity, Activity and Queue (DCAQ)

Understanding demand, capacity and activity at a local and national level is critical to demonstrating the work of CTAC teams, understanding the gaps in service provision and informing future planning. The network session explored different approaches to collecting data within a DCAQ framework.

CTAC Data Collection at a local level

We heard from two teams who have collected data to understand DCAQ within their local services.

- Maya Cross Primary Care Lead Nurse, Aberdeenshire HSCP shared her team's
 experience of participating in Healthcare Improvement Scotland Primary Care Access
 Programme. They worked with five GP practices to gather data to understand the
 demand for services, the percentage of appointments covered by CTAC and the
 percentage provided by practice staff. This data helped demonstrate the impact CTAC
 has on each practice.
- Lesley Middlemiss Primary Care Improvement Programme Manager, NHS Forth Valley shared her team's approach to gathering data. They used data available via the Ordercomms system to explore one clinical area. This helped them understand the demand, activity and capacity needed for phlebotomy services within CTAC.

DCAQ national insights - request to network members

- Scottish Government are keen to understand DCAQ within CTAC teams to inform national planning. We have been asked to use the network to support a simple data capture to understand demand and activity at a national level. We want this to be meaningful and to reflect what is happening on the ground.
- We need volunteers to help design and test a simple data tool to understand demand and activity.
- The data tools developed in the test will be shared at the next network session.
- Once we have agreed a tool, we will ask all network members to complete a data capture to help inform future planning around demand and activity within CTAC services. We will use this data to share insights on the work of CTAC teams across Scotland.

Network members discussed the DCAQ approach, how this has been used locally and the request for national level data. Although there are many challenges around data collection, discussions included practical approaches to addressing challenges: starting small, using manual data collection and working with what you have. Some questions were raised regarding the national data capture. Any tools will be designed with network members and the theme of the next network session will be on reviewing and discussing the tools developed, so all network members have an opportunity to influence this work.
