



## Introduction – Our Why?

- Within NHS Ayrshire and Arran:
- No change in Falls rate/median for several years.
- Previous attempts at improving falls but no dedicated support for Falls Improvement
- No clear vision/plan for falls we wanted to try something different

To reduce Falls by 20% FWH by 30% by Sept 2023






