Mr G.

Current Housing

Mr G is 73 and lives alone in a first floor private let flat

Medical condition & status

Mr G has Diabetes and has had a left below knee amputation (3/1/16).

He has diabetes and Chronic Renal Failure

He is on Peritoneal dialysis at home

Date of Admission to hospital 11/12/15

Date fit for discharge 23/1/16

Defined as delayed discharge - 4/2/16

When was rehousing first identified?

22/1/16







What has happened... Who, what, when...

Mr G was admitted for assessment but with the likely outcome of amputation.

He is now wheelchair dependent and his home was assessed 16/1/16 and deemed to be unsuitable for an interim arrangement until a suitable ground floor wheelchair accessible property is identified, as there is very limited wheelchair access internally.

Current situation

He needs 2 bedrooms to accommodate his dialysis equipment and full wheelchair access.

He refused a new build amenity property as too far away. Offered new build wheelchair property but said offer had come too soon and he wasn't ready to move yet. Property was not going to be ready for several months and would have been built to his specifications but customer still refused

Mr G has declined to be moved to a nursing home until a suitable property is identified, and **remains in hospital** (as at end of July 2016).
