Findings of the Review

- Informed by Occupational Therapy Staff
- HSCP System characterised by potential for duplication, 'hand off's between professional groups and services
- Different approaches to the provision of aids and adaptations
- Challenges in accessing and sharing information
- Differences in how we measure our performance
- Best use of a skilled resource?

Recommendations

- Future Direction of Occupational Therapy
- Core Role for all HSCP Occupational Therapy Staff
- Specialist Knowledge and Skills
- Embedding OT's within MDT Construct with clarity of role and contribution to MDT
- Review of management, professional leadership and governance arrangements.







Recommendations

- Service User Pathways and Process's
- improve the service user experience of our pathways and processes
- Financial Framework, Equipment and Adaptation Eligibility
- -revisiting our eligibility criteria to ensure that they are consistent across all our care groups and teams
- Partnership working with the Housing Sector
- role and contribution of the HSCP in supporting aids and adaptations.
- role of HSCP OTs in supporting assessment and provision of aids and adaptations as part of a co-ordinated person-centred approach.







Recommendations

- Future Occupational Therapy Workforce, Management, Professional Leadership and Governance
- We recommended that a workforce plan be developed to identify the future OT workforce profile, alignment and skills across Glasgow City HSCP in line with the new direction for Occupational Therapy.
- Performance Standards and Indicators (Performance Framework)
- It is recommended that a single, consistent and coherent performance framework be put in place for Occupational Therapy services across the HSCP.

Planning and Implementation

- Focus on planning and active implementation informed by 'Tests of Change'
- Frontline OT Staff involved and supported to undertake tests of change
- 'Tests of Change' include screening, aids and equipment, shadowing opportunities etc

- Development of Core Role, Specialist Skills, Contribution to MDT etc – opportunities to become involved
