52% CQLs in post in Scotland.

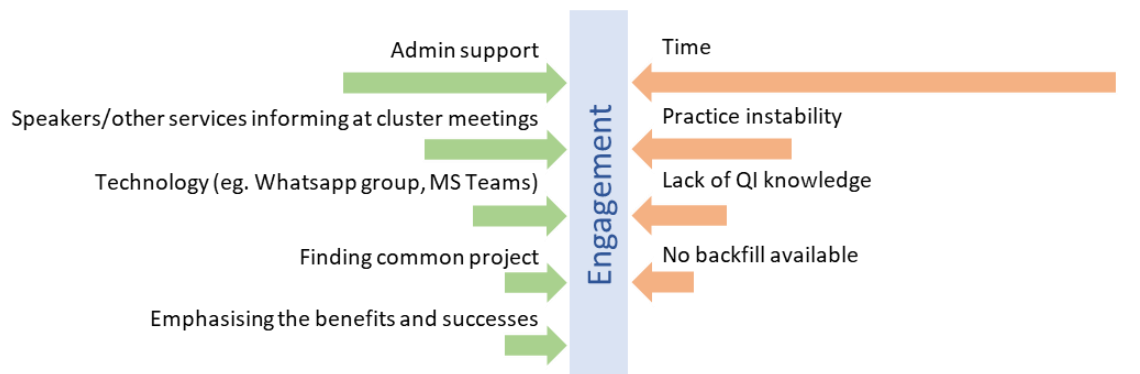
There were also **18** non-CQLs (e.g. clinical leads, primary care leads, practice managers, special boards, etc.) that registered.

What has helped you to increase engagement in cluster work? Vs Roadblocks to engagement



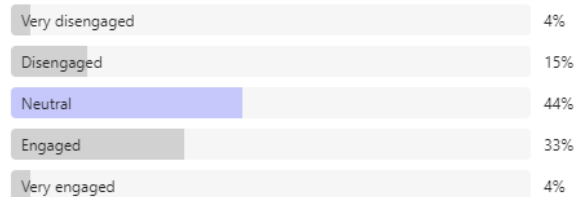

CQL Network sessions – top themes



CQL network sessions

- Mainly MS Teams / virtual meetings with an annual face-to-face meeting.
- Avoid Mondays and Fridays, rotate day and provide sufficient notice.
- Lunchtime meetings.
- Quarterly or 4 monthly meetings most preferred.
- Generally people open to others (especially PQLs and HSCP/board reps) joining the meetings but also protected time for CQLs to come together.
- A mix of formal presentations (e.g. project presentations) and informal small group discussion was preferred.
- Various topics were suggested:
 - How to deal with practices/PQLs not engaged (5)
 - Support clusters/CQLs have in different areas (3)
 - Successful projects (2)
 - Skills development: soft skills (1), leadership skills (1), QI education (1)
 - Sharing/presentations from CQLs in all areas (1)
 - What is happening nationally (1)
 - Consider everyone's priorities in QI topics - collaboration? (1)
 - Involvement from NHS Boards/HSCP (1)
 - Roles and responsibilities of CQLs – intrinsic and extrinsic (1)
 - Are there other services eg. AHPs, leads who are linked to PC? (1)
 - Getting to know each other (1)



Some mentioned measures need to be considered to support participation (e.g. PLT, funding, hybrid events).

- 'may be self-selective where some CQLs may not join'

Database of QI projects



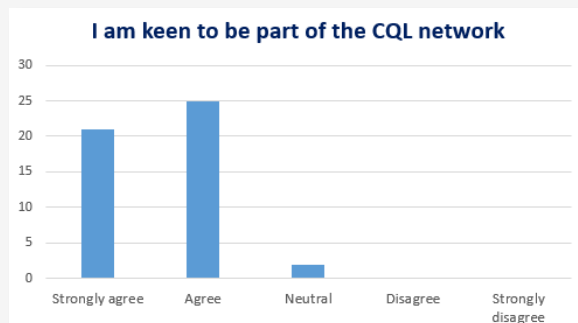
- Single page summary (e.g. title and abstract), with contact details and tools used
- 'Keeping existing records of cluster activity up to date and close obsolete'
- 'Databases could be useful but would seem to be top-down rather than bottom-up working'
- Avoid duplication by linking with existing local databases
- 'Not sure anyone has time to look at a database - we have loads of case studies on line to limited effect' (*non-CQL group*)

Other potential activities

- Email server, Whatsapp
- Website for clusters to add their resources to share with others and learn
- Off-the-self QI projects

NOTE - Participants were also asked about their improvement and non-improvement priorities at practice, cluster and board/HSCP level. Some groups ran out of time to complete and some comments on the Jamboard needed clarification. A follow up discussion will take place at the next meeting.
